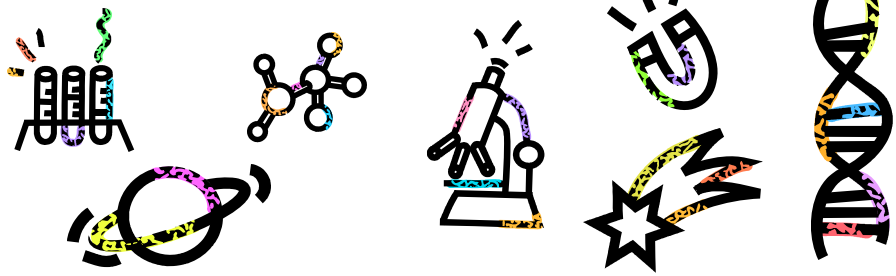

The Infinity Event is a two-part workshop to prepare teachers and their students to attend the Children's Dance Theatre Spring concert, a fully-produced, annual performance, at the Capitol Theatre.

The Children's Dance Theatre's Spring Concert will explore different aspects of science including DNA, the solar system, light, experimentation, rainforests and much more.

Event Workshop I:

Participants explore movement lesson plans and ideas as they work together to integrate dance and other art forms into the classroom. This workshop is followed by colleague collaboration, mentoring, and classroom implementation of lesson plans.

Event Workshop II:

Participants come together for colleague collaboration to discuss in class implementation, as well as gain a knowledge of the performance, costume designs, musical composition and choreographic processes for the upcoming production.

Workshop participants are invited to attend a school matinee performance with their students on a first come, first served basis or one of the public performances. 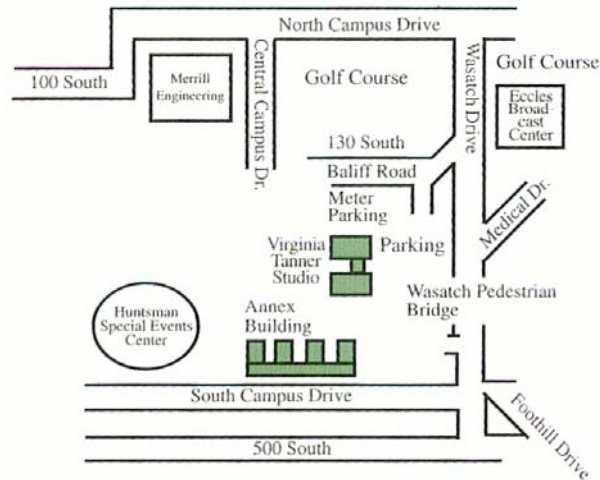

DIRECTIONS COMING FROM 100 SOUTH: Take 100 South up towards the University Hospital and Huntsman Cancer. Turn right onto Wasatch Drive. Turn right (just across the street from the Eccles Broadcast Center) onto Baliff Road. Then you take another immediate left, go around a sharp turn, and then turn left into our parking lot.

DIRECTIONS COMING FROM 400 SOUTH: Come down Wasatch Drive as if you are heading up to the University Hospital. Just under the Legacy bridge, you will get in your left hand lane and turn left at the light to continue on Wasatch. You take your next immediate left (just across the street from the Eccles Broadcast Center) onto Baliff Road. Then you take another immediate left, go around a sharp turn, and then turn left into our parking lot.
